WORKING DEFINITIONS

- Natural Resources any biological, mineral, or aesthetic asset afforded by nature without human intervention that can be used for some form of benefit, whether material (economic) or immaterial.
- Civilization An advanced stage in a society's development of arts and sciences and accompanied by corresponding social, political and cultural complexity.

COLONIALISM VS. CONSERVATION

Prevention of wasteful use of a resource

- Why?: God, Gold, and Glory
 - Rome: primary goal of colonization was not to supply the poor with land, but to serve the military needs of the Roman state.


