Art


Art acts as a collective memory of society.


Education

Ancient Egypt 3000+ years



Developed two types of formal schools for privileged youth under the supervision of governmental officials

One for scribes and the other for priest trainees.

At the age of 5, pupils entered the writing school and continued their studies in reading and writing until the age of 16 or 17.

Beyond disciplines



Religious education and philosophy were taught alongside secular subjects, impressing upon students a strong moral foundation.

They believed you became wise by following moral principles, such as truth.


There is no doubt ancient Egyptians held education in high regard and saw it as a privilege.

Were not permitted to go to school. They were instructed at home by their mothers, with the expectation that they would become wives and mothers themselves, tutored in the arts of cooking, sewing, religion, and reading.

Ancient Rome 1100 years




Rome never formally instituted a state-sponsored form of elementary education.

They never legally required its people to be educated on any level

Roman children of wealthy families received their education from private tutors.

Roman girls




The education of women was a controversial subject in the Roman period. Basic skills of reading and writing were taught to most girls in the Roman upper and middle classes

Sport in Ancient Egyptian



Fishing, rowing, javelinthrowing, boxing, wrestling, weightlifting, and gymnastics. The most frequently played team sport was field hockey and a game like a tug-of-war played with a hoop. Archery was also popular but mainly associated with the nobility and royalty.
